A Message from our President and CEO

One of the most beautiful things about Network Health is that we are a growing organization. In 2023, our membership grew to over 124,000 and more importantly, Network Health continues to grow in many other ways as well.

Network Health continues to prioritize quality. For the third year in a row, we earned a 5 out of 5 overall Star rating for our Medicare Advantage PPO plans from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS)*. Network Health is the only individual Medicare Advantage plan in Wisconsin to achieve a 5 Star rating. Nationally, Network Health is one of only 31 Medicare Advantage plans that earned CMS' highest overall rating of 5 out of 5 Stars for 2024. This is out of 545 Medicare Advantage contracts and it puts Network Health among the nation's elite Medicare health plans.

In addition, Network Health steadily improved over the last four years and currently ranks second in quality for the State of Wisconsin Group Health Insurance Program. The National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) has also recognized Network Health as one of only two health plans in our service area with their 4.5 Star designation for both our Medicare and Commercial lines of business.



Growth and quality go hand in hand for our employees as well. Network Health continues to develop into a best-in-class employer in Wisconsin. Once again, we were awarded the National Business Research Institute (NBRI) Circle of Excellence Award that recognizes organizations with exceptional levels of employee engagement.

Growing our community impact also remains a priority and in the following pages, you will see a sampling of how Network Health supports health equity and education, people who serve our country, healthy activities, art in the community and other local partnerships.



In Milwaukee, Network Health supports over 800 families including our partnership with Gee's Clippers and Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin to donate 300 Thanksgiving meals to families in our urban communities.

Over 500 turkeys and non-perishables were donated in partnership with **CBS 58's Drive Thru Food Drive** in supporting the **Hunger Task Force**.





Once again, we partnered with Walgreens, Walmart and Hometown Pharmacies to offer Vaccine clinics to our Medicare Advantage members.
Staying healthy, especially during flu season is critical for long-term health. We administered over 3,600 flu vaccines and RSV vaccines to keep our members safe.



For decades Network Health employees have donated a steady blood supply to The Community **Blood Center** and **Versiti Blood Center of** Wisconsin to ensure our neighbors have access to the lifesaving blood needed. Our Menasha office hosted five blood drives, donated 71 pints of blood this year and helped save 213 lives with their whole blood donations.

Network Health continues to be active in the Arts and Wellness community by offering complimentary memberships at the **Museum of Wisconsin Art (MOWA**). Each month, Network Health partners with MOWA to offer educational programming to the community.


